Brief summary of the content of the workshop	The aim of the workshop was to inform and teach the participants about Mediation in teaching, learning and assessment and to highlight its importance in foreign language teaching, as well as to present many ways in which mediation can be implemented in the classroom (not only in foreign language teaching but also in for example CLIL classes). The first part of the workshop consisted of a theoretical introduction of the project, while the second part focused more on developing the practical skills of the participants by creating examples of mediation tasks in groups.
What did you find particularly useful?	The tasks themselves are very useful and implementable in the courses I teach. It was very exciting to start to realize all the situations where the students would benefit from their mediation skills, as well as to learn how to create tasks for facilitate and develop these skills among the students. Moreover, given that I am a teacher educator, I intend to pass on the gained knowledge onto further generations.
