This was the first activity that students did in lockdown. It consisted of creating a poster whose main picture was a rainbow. This rainbow was the symbol of the lockdown period. Afterwards, they recorded themselves showing their creations and expressing, in English, how these posters had been created and what special sensation they had felt about it. It was very emotional.
