<b>Brief summary of the content of the workshop</b>	<p>This workshop supports teachers in European classrooms in using action research as an essential tool for the development of reflective classroom practice highlighting ways in which teachers can enhance their self-confidence and professionalism. This in turn will improve the quality of their teaching and at the same time strengthen teacher confidence.</p> <p>The main issues of conducting action research have been presented to all participants (tools, goal-orientation, emphasis on professional reflection and development). In groups of four, we show examples of best practices in different educational context of the participants' countries. The quality aspect in education was discussed among participants.</p>
<b>What did you find particularly useful?</b>	Importance of Action Research, the way how to conduct it in own classroom, AR tools,
<b>How will you use what you learnt / developed in the event in your professional context?</b>	I will conduct an action research in my school together with collaboration with Macedonian representative, Dragana Gjoreska. The topic of our mini project is <i>CLIL IN SECONDARY VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS SEEN THROUGH STUDENTS' PERSPECTIVE</i> . The issues we are going to consider are: students' challenges learning CLIL, methodology used in classroom, advantages and disadvantages of CLIL, and language skills which are most important and best required in our lessons). At the end of the research we will compare teachers' predictions and students' responses. The tools that will be used in this AR are: questionnaire, teacher's diary and interview. This action research should give answers about our own teaching practices in CLIL classrooms and check if students enjoy learning CLIL, something should be changed in terms of methodology, some activities are not appropriate, vocabulary exercises are satisfactory, students recognize the importance of language skills corresponding to their scope of future work.
<b>How will you further contribute to the project?</b>	I will promote AR in the seminar that will be conducted in organisation of Faculty of Philology, Belgrade University. The authors of the seminar are Julijana

	<p>Vuco, Katarina Zavisin and Danijela Manic. The seminar will be addressing CLIL issues and CLIL teachers all around Serbia (primary and secondary schools), therefore AR would be appropriate way of reflection. We would assign a task to participants to try out AR in their context and their classrooms and ask for feedback.</p> <p>I will be in contact with colleagues from Poland and Czech Republic who are going to conduct AR among CLIL teachers, and the results will be compared and used for the purpose of considering the position of CLIL teachers in Serbia, since I have already done the similar research in my country.</p> <p>It would be very useful for further improvement of CLIL teaching in Serbian educational context to realise mutual advantages and disadvantages in CLIL environment.</p>

Predstavnik Srbije će u saradnji sa predstavnikom Makedonije sprovesti akciono istraživanje sa učenicima srednjih stručnih škola (vazduhoplovna i ekonomska škola) koji u svojoj nastavi imaju zastupljenu CLIL metodu.
