Brief summary of the content of the workshop	This workshop embraced the teachers and the issue of improving the professionalism in the classroom. All in all, it showed the ways of helping the teachers always to stay updated and learn how to evaluate their work. There were different participants mostly from EU member countries which have met these issues in the recent years, and also some EU aspirant countries which have recently started implementing action research as part of the process of education.
