Plan for action research tools

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Step 1: Arrange the following statements in a descending order of importance

For me action research means...

- ... taking time and gaining distance in a hectic daily life to reflect upon my own actions in the classroom.
- ... an (intensive) concern with the questions that I normally shelve/ put to one side ... a method of putting reflective thoughts into action.
- ... a very good way of documenting, revising and reaching my aims.
- ... a reflection on my own teaching with the aim of recognising problems and solving these as far as possible.
