

Data collection

For your action research it is essential to collect data in an objective way without interpreting – yet.

Make a collection of what you have and what the tools have generated:

- Notes made for example during observations
- Recordings including audio and video recordings as well as photos
- Feedback from those involved (students, colleagues)
 - Memos
 - Questionnaires
 - Interviews
- Refer back to Step 2("On your way") in the spiral, "Record & Sort"
- Read and listen to your evidence
- Take a step back
- Consider which data will be useful for which purposes
- Start by highlighting passages that you find particularly interesting
