Brief summary of the content of the workshop	The Workshop focused on language teaching that integrates task-based learning, social interactions and the use of digital media in order to create real life tasks. It included the hands-on development of real life tasks for different levels of language learning that use apps and also the social media. The tasks created were put onto the moodle platform of the project and are to be piloted by the participants of the workshop.

Das Projekt „e-lang: Digital literacy for the teaching and learning of language“ bietet eine pädagogisch-didaktische Grundlage zur Professionalisierung der Lehrkräfte und verbindet didaktische Ansätze für den Erwerb und die Anwendung digitaler Kompetenzen mit der Förderung der Selbstständigkeit im schulischen Fremdsprachenunterricht. Zugleich zielt das Projekt ab auf einen Unterricht, der die Vertiefung „echter“ sozialer Interaktion in der Fremdsprache ermöglicht. In einem Workshop haben Expertinnen und Experten Lernaufgaben erstellt, die den Fokus auf reale Kommunikation legen (real life tasks). In diesem Rahmen sollen Schülerinnen und Schüler Texte erstellen, die über die sozialen Medien, Apps oder auch Plattformen wie Wikipedia veröffentlicht und damit in die Lebenswirklichkeit getragen werden. Der Aufgabenpool wird auf der moodle Plattform des Projektes eingestellt und soll von den Teilnehmerinnen und Teilnehmern im Nachgang zum workshop pilotiert werden. Daneben sollen im Verlauf des Projektes u.a. Trainingsmodule und Webinare entstehen.

Insbesondere im Rahmen der Strategie zur digitalen Bildung leistet dieses Projekt einen wichtigen Beitrag. Hier wird exemplarisch aufgezeigt, wie digitale Kompetenzen im Bereich des Fremdsprachenunterrichts ausgebildet werden können und gleichzeitig didaktische Konzepte wie Anwendungsorientierung, authentische Kontexte und soziale Interaktion zusammengeführt und zu einem motivierenden Lernarrangement verbunden werden.
