Brief summary of the content of the workshop	<p>The workshop <i>Digital literacy for the teaching and learning of languages</i> took place from 10 to 11 October in Graz, Austria, on the premises of the ECML.</p> <p>The first day started with a short presentation of the ECML by the Executive Director, Ms Sarah Breslin, after which the e-lang project and the workshop objectives were introduced. The “Pedagogical Framework” of the project, on the basis of which the teaching/learning tasks (‘real-world’ tasks) were to be designed, was presented next. Participants were already familiar with the principles of the framework, as it had been sent to them several weeks before. An open discussion on the framework and on real world tasks followed, during which several questions were asked.</p> <p>After that, participants formed groups of eight in order to design ‘real-world’ tasks. The tasks were uploaded on the moodle platform, which had been created for the workshop (<a href="https://moodle.e-lang.ecml.at/">https://moodle.e-lang.ecml.at/</a>) and were presented to all participants. An open discussion followed and feedback of the first day was given.</p> <p>On the second day, the workshop started with a presentation of the structure of the online “e-lang project training platform”, which is under construction and which consists of several training modules that will be used by teachers according to their needs.</p>

	<p>Participants worked in groups and at first they tried to discover the online modules of the course in order to give feedback on them. Next, in their groups, they tried to integrate strategies presented in the modules and/or resources into the real-world tasks they had already developed on the previous day. A presentation of their suggestions followed as well as an open discussion.</p> <p>At the end of the workshop participants discussed their potential involvement in the project.</p>
<p><b>What did you find particularly useful?</b></p>	<p><b>The fact that participants had the chance to apply the theoretical principles of the “Pedagogical Framework” in practice, by designing activities that could be used in the classroom, collaborating with each other. The collective experience of people from diverse backgrounds brought added value to the activities.</b></p>
<p><b>How will you use what you learnt / developed in the event in your professional context?</b></p>	<p><b>First of all, the content of the Workshop and the principles of the Pedagogical Framework will shape the content of the training activities (seminars, workshops, etc), which I am going to organise in my region for teachers of English. In addition, the online training programme or parts of it could be used for the development of teacher training activities. Furthermore, I will disseminate the programme to teachers so that they can complete it themselves, electronically.</b></p>

Το διήμερο 10-11 Οκτωβρίου 2017 πραγματοποιήθηκε στο Ευρωπαϊκό Κέντρο Σύγχρονων Γλωσσών (ECML), στο Γκρας της Αυστρίας, Εργαστήριο (Workshop) με θέμα: *Digital literacy for the teaching and learning of languages*, στο πλαίσιο αντίστοιχου προγράμματος του ECML ([www.ecml.at/elang](http://www.ecml.at/elang)). Το παρακολούθησαν περίπου 40 συμμετέχοντες από όλες τις Ευρωπαϊκές χώρες, από διαφορετικούς τομείς της εκπαίδευσης.

Στην ηλεκτρονική πλατφόρμα (<https://moodle.e-lang.ecml.at/>) που δημιουργήθηκε για τις ανάγκες του εργαστηρίου αναρτήθηκε το «Παιδαγωγικό Πλαίσιο» (Pedagogical Framework) του προγράμματος καθώς και μια πρώτη έκδοση ενός ηλεκτρονικού επιμορφωτικού προγράμματος με αρκετές θεματικές ενότητες. Μετά την ολοκλήρωσή του, θα μπορεί να αξιοποιηθεί από τους εκπαιδευτικούς για αυτό-επιμόρφωση.

Το πρόγραμμα *Digital literacy for the teaching and learning of languages* αναμένεται να συμβάλει στην περαιτέρω ανάπτυξη του ψηφιακού γραμματισμού εκπαιδευτικών και μαθητών. Ζητούμενο είναι οι μαθητές να εμπλέκονται σε δραστηριότητες πραγματικής ζωής που έχουν νόημα για αυτούς, με στόχο αφενός την ανάπτυξη των γλωσσικών τους δεξιοτήτων και αφετέρου την ανάπτυξη ψηφιακών δεξιοτήτων ζωής καθώς και της αυτονομίας τους στη μάθηση. Απαραίτητη προϋπόθεση για την ανάπτυξη γλωσσικών και γενικότερα επικοινωνιακών δεξιοτήτων αποτελεί η **κοινωνική αλληλεπίδραση**. Η αξιοποίηση ψηφιακών εργαλείων, κυρίως των Μέσων Κοινωνικής Δικτύωσης, επιτρέπει στους μαθητές να βγουν από τα στενά όρια της τάξης και τους παρέχει τη δυνατότητα για πραγματική κοινωνική αλληλεπίδραση.
