Tačiau šių priemonių taikymas mokymo procese nėra optimalus ir pakankamas dėl įvairių priežasčių: gebėjimų trūkumo naudotis IKT, mokyklos finansinių galimybių ar bendruomenės susitarimų.

Internetu nuolat gausėjant kalbos mokymo ir mokymosi puslapių, labai svarbu susipažinti ir su jų teikiama nauda, taikymo ypatumais bei saugumu. Projektas, organizuotas ECML, suteikė man galimybę susipažinti su skaitmeninių technologijų įvairove, jų integracija į kasdienį mokymą, išbandyti įvairius kalbos mokymo metodus, susipažinti su socialinių tinklų kūrimu. Didžiausia šio projekto vertybė - galimybė bendrauti ir bendradarbiauti su viso pasaulio pedagogais, dalintis darbo patirtimi, išgirsti ir sužinoti naujų, dar nebandytų darbo metodų, naudojant skaitmenines technologijas kalbų mokymui. Projekto įgyvendinimo metu buvo aptartos ir socialinių tinklų grėsmės bei elgesys šioms grėsmėms atsiradus.
