


Assessment strategies to support language education

A global approach to language assessment

Even if the main objective of a language class is to help learners become increasingly independent in the use of the target language(s), language education has a much wider scope. This tool considers the role of assessment to support language learning environments where modern languages flourish.

Meso ◀▶ Nano	<input type="checkbox"/> How can a school value language diversity? How can a school take into account the various linguistic needs of the students? <input type="checkbox"/> How can a school highlight every (intermediate) success in the language learning process?
Meso ◀▶ Micro	<input type="checkbox"/> How can a school assess, develop and value the language proficiency of subject teachers? <input type="checkbox"/> How can a common view be developed among all teachers on language skills in assessment?
Macro ◀▶ Nano	<input type="checkbox"/> How should language curricula evolve to change students' perception of assessment? <input type="checkbox"/> How can language certificates evolve in order to take into account plurilingual and intercultural competencies?
