In this way it promotes deep learning and helps develop responsible, global citizens.


Who is it for?

Keys for EOL

Dimensions of subject specific literacies draws on language resources, either in the mother tongue or in other languages which are part of the learner's repertoire.

“Language as a means for learning about the world. It models learning as a process of making meaning, and language learning as building one's meaning making potential to make meaning in particular contexts. Knowledge is viewed as meaning, a resource for understanding and acting on the world. All knowledge is constituted in semiotic systems with language as the most central.” (Mohan *et al.* 2010:221)
