Brief summary of the content of the workshop	We first discussed aspects of efficient learning environments in the partner countries and institutions. In this first phase we had the chance to talk to the other participants and share lots of examples of good practice. Then we got to know the EOL matrix and worked in groups on the challenges and solutions of fictitious schools.  In the next step we used the same approach to improve the learning environments in our own institutions. We identified the strengths and assets as well as the schools' challenges and needs. Be combining them we identified several possible ways to improve the learning environments.
What did you find particularly useful?	The best things in any international workshop are the informal exchanges with highly competent staff from other countries and settings.  Apart from this I found the concept of the EOL matrix very useful because it opens possible solution paths on different levels (nano to macro) and thus opens a wider field of action.
How will you use what you learnt / developed in the event in your professional context?	I will use the matrix in my team meetings to identify challenges and find solutions that we may not yet have thought about.
How will you further contribute to the project?	This was my first contact with the project. I will certainly explore the online resources in this project and contribute examples of best practice wherever possible.
How do you plan to disseminate the project? - to colleagues - to a professional association - in a professional journal/website - in a newspaper - other	I will present the EOL matrix to my team in school and at the Pädagogische Hochschule and Graz University and work with it. When the project website has been finished, I will share it with my colleagues.
