<p>Eiropas Savienības moderno valodu centrā (<i>The European Centre for Modern Languages, ECML</i>) veikts pētījums, kurš apstiprina agrīnās valodas apguves vērtību un norāda galvenās grūtības, izaicinājumus ar ko saskaras vecāki, skolotāji un paši bērni. ECML piedāvā virkni atbalsta materiālus, kura pamatā ir daudzvalodu un starpkultūru pieeja. Piedāvā aktīvo, komunikatīvo un interaktīvo mācību metožu un jauno tehnoloģiju izmantošanu. Aicina skolotājus sadarboties ar vecākiem, jo ģimenes un izglītības iestādes sadarbība atbalsta mācību procesu un veicina labvēlīgu attieksmi pret citām valodām, kultūrām. Bērni, vecumā no 2 līdz 4 gadiem atrodas "dabiskās" valodas apguves fāzē un viņiem viegli tas padodas. Jautājumi, kuri prasa papildus pētījumus un eksperimentus: cik ilgtspējīga ir valodu prasme, kas apgūta agrīnā vecumā? Kā skolotājam strādāt multikulturālā grupā, kur valodas līmeņa prasmes ir atšķirīgas? Kādai ir jābūt skolotāja kvalifikācijai (valodas prasmēm), lai palīdzētu katra bērna valodas izaugsmē? Kādus kvalitātes kritērijus vajadzētu izmantot, lai novērtētu agrīnu valodas apguvi?</p> <p>2018.gada 12. un 13. septembrī, Austrijas pilsētā Grāca, notika starptautisks seminārs, kur ieradās 39 pārstāvji (eksperti, skolotāji) no 30 ECML dalībvalstīm. Projekta komandas vadība informēja par jaunākajiem pētījuma datiem, kuri iegūti strādājot pie šī projektu. Tika apspriesti galvenie mācīšanās principi, piejas, stratēģijas, kas veicina valodas mācīšanos agrīnajā vecumposmā no 3 līdz 12 gadiem. Semināra laikā kopīgi tika meklētas atbildes: kāpēc valodas mācīšanās ir svarīga un kā tā notiek šajā vecumposmā? Kas kavē šo procesu un kāds atbalsts ir nepieciešams?</p> <p>Kas var būt vēl iedvesmojošāks kā prakse, kura jau darbojas dažādās Eiropas skolās! Dalībnieki dalījās ar esošiem, izstrādātiem materiāliem, resursiem: spēlēm, grāmatām, projektiem, kur galvenie līdzdalībnieki bija paši bērni (e-twinning, ecoschool), IT rīki utt.
