Inspiring stories about language learning

All the languages I know

Context:

in Brussels (www.eeb1.eu). The ES are multicultural and multilingual institutions for children from all EU countries. The language of the section is French, but there are also bilingual/plurilingual children and children with many different home languages.

Reasons for choosing this activity:

The main aims are to make children become aware of their linguistic repertoires; the roles of different languages in their lives; to motivate them to learn new languages.

Description:

- The teacher talks with the children about the languages they use. The children reflect on their language repertoires. They talk about the languages they understand, speak, listen and/or write; which languages they use with whom; etc. (→ meaningful language learning; actively relying on linguistic repertoires).
- As individual work, each child draws a figure. He/she places the flags representing his/her languages on the relevant parts of the body according to the personal use of these languages.



The activity takes place in a fourth and fifth class of the European School • The children discuss the reasons for placing the flags on the different parts of the figure. They explain their attitudes to languages, the different circumstances in which they use a certain language, why they like some languages more than others, they also think about other languages they would like to learn, etc. (→ language learning is a process).

Variation:

In another class, instead of drawing the colours of the flags, the children use pictograms in different languages placing them on the relevant parts of the figure.








Observation:
