# Plurilingual fashion show

## Context:

- A primary school in Dublin, Ireland. English is the language of schooling. The Irish language is a curricular subject with 3.5 hours per week teaching allocation.
- There are 25 children in this Sixth Class (age 11+). Twenty of these children speak home languages other than English. Within this group there are 12 different language backgrounds.

#### Reasons for choosing the activity:

• The teacher uses the children's interest in putting on a fashion show as a means of incorporating all the languages of the classroom, thereby helping to develop her pupils' plurilingual skills.


#### **Description:**

 As part of their end of primary school celebrations, one class asks their teacher if they could organise a fashion show, promising to undertake all the organization and preparation themselves. The teacher agrees with the provision that all the languages at their disposal are used at some point in the event. Children acted as commentators, models and sound technicians (→ holistic land meaningful language learning).  A further expectation of the children is that they would undertake a written exercise. To do this, they have to invent a fictitious model describing them in all the languages within their particular competence
 (→ continuous and coherent

#### **Observation:**

language learning).

 Agreeing to the production of a fashion show while insisting that the full linguistic repertoire of the group be used, tapped into children's expressed interests (→ relying on linguistic repertoires).
