Brief summary of the content of the workshop	The overall aim of the project is to support the social and educational recognition of home languages and to value and validate pupils' plurilingual repertoires. The project will collect and analyse examples of how migrant pupils' home languages are evaluated. This, in turn, will help to define criteria and to produce appropriate materials for formative evaluation. The workshop began with the project team presenting the aims, objectives and expected outcomes of the project. This was followed by presentations about evaluation systems currently used by organisations in Switzerland, Germany and France. Participants analysed these evaluation materials and assessed their relevance and adaptability for their own contexts. Participants then considered and identified key criteria for evaluating home language competences and the conditions to be considered for the implementation of evaluation activities.

RECOLANG: Resources for Assessing the Home Language Competences of Migrant Pupils

The RECOLANG project's overall aim is to support the social and educational recognition of home languages and to value and validate pupils' plurilingual repertoires. Recognising home language competences is viewed as a means of achieving greater social equity and enhanced educational outcomes for migrant students.

The project will collect and analyse examples of how migrant pupils' home languages are evaluated. This,





in turn, will help to define criteria and to produce appropriate materials for the implementation of formative evaluation activities. The project period is 2020-2022. RECOLANG is supported by countries signatory to the European Cultural Convention.

The expected outcomes are:

- o a mapping of current practices in relation to testing of pupils' home language competences.
- o a database of evaluation materials linked to CEFR descriptor levels.
- o an assessment training module and user guide.

The target groups are: teachers, individuals and institutions involved in assessment of language competences and decision makers in language policy.

The key beneficiaries of the project will be:

- Teachers & educational institutions who seek relevant and appropriate resources to carry out assessment of migrant learners' language competences.
- Stakeholders who wish to bridge home language competences with the language(s) of schooling and curricular activities.
- Stakeholders who wish to implement pluri- and multilingual approaches to teaching & learning.
- o Stakeholders who wish to develop home language education and provision.
- Learners who seek recognition, validation and/or certification of plurilingual and intercultural competences.
