Schließlich ist es das Ziel der österreichischen Bildungsinstitutionen unabhängige, selbstbewußte, fähige, gebildete junge Menschen zu erziehen und zu bilden, die für die Herausforderungen des Lebens im 21. Jahrhundert gerüstet sein sollen. Bislang wurden die transversalen Kompetenzen: Wirtschafts-, Finanz- und Verbraucher/innenbildung , Verkehrs- und Mobilitätsbildung, Umweltbildung, Sprachliche Bildung und Lesen, Sexualpädagogik, Reflexive Geschlechterpädagogik und Gleichstellung, Politische Bildung, Medienbildung, Interkulturelle Bildung, Informatische Bildung, Gesundheitsförderung , Entrepreneurship Education, Bildungs-, Berufs- und Lebensorientierung in neue Lehrpläne für die Primarstufe, Sekundarstufe I als fächerübergreifende zu erlernende Kompetenzen eingebaut. Was nun dringend gebraucht wird sind Fortbildungen, Anleitungen, Erasmusprojekte, universitäre Fortbildungen und workshops, die diese Kompetenzen für alle, die im primären, sekundären und universitären Bildungsbereich tätig sind. Für diese Personen wird noch eine Schärfung der Bedeutung dieser Kompetenzen notwendig sein. Institutionen wie die Karl-Franzens Universität, das österreichische Sprachenkompetenzzentrum, das Bildungsministerium und die pädagogischen Hochschulen sind gefordert auch in Kooperation mit entsprechenden Bildungseinrichtungen andere europäischer Länder diese Möglichkeiten der Vernetzung, Fortbildung und Professionalisierung zu schaffen. Dabei wird das EFSZ eine wertvolle Partnerinstitution darstellen.</p>
