Brief summary of the content of the workshop	Workshop focus: participants had the opportunity to review and discuss the key principles and actions for teachers and educators in making all language learning pathways visible for young children (age 3 to 12) within education systems. In addition, participants had the chance to evaluate their own educational context and experience how these can be used to acknowledge and support young children in developing their multilingual competences, plurilingual practices and intercultural awareness.			
	I found the opportunity particularly helpful to exchange ideas with the many different experts from the field and to network. Significant systemic overlaps between the countries were identified, which are important for the further development and support of early foreign language learning.			
What did you find particularly useful?	One of these concerns the training of teachers and educators: Theoretical background knowledge on multilingualism and early language learning must be part of their training. In addition, education systems need to be open and training programmes internationalised in order to promote an understanding of multilingualism and raise awareness of transculturalism.			
	In terms of practical implementation in the classroom, the many materials and recommendations on the project website are also very helpful.			
How will you use what you learnt / developed in the event in your professional context?	At the Goethe-Institut, early foreign language learning is an important topic that is receiving further attention. One planned project is the development of a curriculum for pathways for children's education in German as a Foreign Language. The ideas, inputs and materials developed in the workshop will be very helpful for the development of the curriculum and portfolio. The curriculum is to be used in the			





networks of Goethe-Institut on a national and international level.
