Brief summary of the content of the workshop	The PALINGUI workshop was a dynamic meeting place, with a mix of presentations of the projects, some participants' presentations of research- and other experiences related to the PALINGUI project scope, and discussions in smaller groups. The workshop was very much motivated by having clear aims and objectives with each discussion, so that each group discussion resulted in practical and clear suggestions, for how to continue the project.
What did you find particularly useful?	I found the group discussions particularly useful, both because I got to listen to other people with lots of different expert knowledge in the field(s), but also because there was such a clear focus on solving problems/come up with ideas on how to design the PALINGUI project.
How will you use what you learnt / developed in the event in your professional context?	I will use much of the content in the workshop in my professional context, through the work I do in preschool teacher education. I think that the knowledge that will, in the future, be made accessible to a broader audience, will be possible to use in the preschool teacher program.
How will you further contribute to the project?	I wish to further contribute to the project by participating in upcoming meetings/workshops and continue the discussion about the importance of including national minority languages/heritage languages into the scope of young children's learning pathways, which is one of my areas of expertise, Furthermore, I would like to extend the conversation about how digital resources can be used as a resource both in children's language leaning in many different ways,





but also as a means for young children's self assessment and multimodal pedagogical documentation.

I plan to disseminate the project at the Department of child and youth studies at Stockholm university, and for several other universities, in a national network for preschool research.
