Brief summary of the content of the event	<p>This project aims to demonstrate how the resources already published by the ECML can be adapted to different national contexts following the Recommendation CM/Rec(2022)1 on the importance of plurilingual and intercultural education for a democratic culture. In this way, the project will help member states work towards the realization of effective and inclusive plurilingual and intercultural education.</p> <p>During the event, feedback was provided on the use of the checklist to adapt the resources of the European Center for Modern Languages (ECML). This adaptation process aims to ensure that the resources respond to the different educational contexts and are effective for the specific needs of three professional profiles: teacher trainers, curriculum developers and educational advisors.</p> <p>In parallel, the application of ECML resources has been explored in various practical use scenarios, from primary to higher education, with emphasis on the connection between plurilingual competence and the promotion of democratic citizenship. The objective of this practice was the subsequent development of an intelligent search tool to be integrated into the ECML website.</p>
What did you find particularly useful?	<p>I found the focus on creating adaptable tools particularly useful, as it ensures the ECML resources can be effectively applied to diverse educational contexts. The emphasis on addressing the specific needs of teacher trainers, curriculum developers, and educational advisors is also valuable, as it tailors the project's impact to those directly involved in shaping educational practices. Additionally, the idea of an intelligent search tool is a forward-thinking approach, making it easier for professionals to access relevant materials and apply them effectively. These elements enhance the project's practicality and impact, ensuring it benefits a wide range of educational stakeholders.</p>

Este proyecto tiene como objetivo principal demostrar cómo los recursos ya publicados por el Centro Europeo para las Lenguas Modernas (ECML) pueden adaptarse eficazmente a diversos contextos nacionales, siguiendo la Recomendación CM/Rec(2022)1 sobre la relevancia de la educación plurilingüe e intercultural para fomentar una cultura democrática. A través de esta iniciativa, se busca apoyar a los estados miembros en la implementación de una educación inclusiva que promueva tanto la competencia plurilingüe como la ciudadanía democrática.

El proyecto tiene como propósito desarrollar una herramienta práctica, como una lista de verificación o similar, diseñada para ayudar a los usuarios a adaptar los recursos existentes del Centro Europeo para las Lenguas Modernas (ECML). Esta herramienta permitirá ajustar dichos recursos a las características específicas de los diversos contextos educativos, asegurando su relevancia y efectividad. En particular, está dirigida a satisfacer las necesidades de tres grupos profesionales clave: formadores de profesorado, desarrolladores curriculares y asesores educativos.

Paralelamente, se ha explorado la posibilidad de desarrollar una herramienta de búsqueda inteligente para integrar en la web del ECML que permita al usuario encontrar el recurso que mejor se adapte a su

situación concreta y que le permita desarrollar la competencia plurilingüe y la promoción de la ciudadanía democrática. Este recurso permitirá a los usuarios identificar rápidamente los materiales más adecuados para su contexto, optimizando el tiempo y esfuerzo en la selección de contenidos. Con estas soluciones, el proyecto apoya directamente la mejora de competencias profesionales y contribuye al fortalecimiento de sistemas educativos plurilingües e inclusivos en toda Europa.
