**Das gegründete Netzwerk bietet die Möglichkeit eines außergewöhnlichen internationalen Austausches zu Fragen des Spracherwerbs in beruflichen Kontexten mit Bezug zu den meisten europäischen Ländern. Die breite Streuung der in Teilnehmer hinsichtlich ihres professionellen Zugangs zur Thematik ermöglicht es, Ansprechpartner mit unterschiedlichem Erfahrungshintergrund zu befragen und potentielle Kooperationsbünde interdisziplinärer Art zu bilden.**

**Bereits das erste Treffen zeigte Gemeinsamkeiten zwischen den Nationen, aber auch Unterschiede in den Schwierigkeiten der Lernenden, der geeigneten Ansätze sowie möglichen Ressourcen und half damit auch, die eigene Praxis besser vor dem Hintergrund sozialer, politischer und organisatorischer Rahmenbedingungen zu verstehen. Nicht nur Sprachwissenschaftler und tätige Sprachlehrkräfte sondern insbesondere auch Verantwortliche in Fragen der Wirtschafts-/Berufspädagogik, Personalentwicklung, Organisationspädagogik und Bildungspolitik können von dem langjährigen Erfahrungsschatz profitieren und Impulse für eigene Projekte/Probleme erhalten.**

**Interessant in der Zukunft wird beispielsweise die Frage nach der Verankerung von Zweitsprachlern in beruflichen Kontexten in Human Resource Management Ansätze sowie vergleichende Analysen von Sprachförderkonzepten in den beteiligten Ländern.**

**Aus der Netzwerkarbeit resultierende Publikationen können in der Zukunft eine breite Streuung sowie nachhaltige Verankerung erreichen, da das Netzwerk über starke Verbindungen in unterschiedliche Disziplinen, Politikebenen und Zielgruppen aufweisen kann.**
