Seminaril toimusid arutelud immigrantide ja kohalike vähemuste töölase keeleoskuse arendamise efektiivsete viiside üle, samuti jagasid oma maa kogemusi selles vallas võrgustiku liikmed. Eriti elava diskussiooni kustus esile külalisesineja prof Laurent Filliettazi (University of Geneva) ettekanne “Recognising and sustaining the linguistic demands of the workplace. Contributions from a sociocopragmatic perspective”, mis näitas, kuidas töökoha keeleliste vajaduste alased uurimused võivad olla kasuks vadkonna praktikutele.
