| Brief summary of the content of the workshop | During 3-day workshop teachers, teacher trainers and decision makers from 27 different countries worked on designing realistic implementation schemes for ECML products in relation to plurilingual and intercultural education. We were provided with the publications within four projects: MARILLE, EPOSTL, PluriMobil and CLIL-LOTE START presented and analysed through plenary discussion and participants group work. “Results” were evaluated on a daily basis. |
| What did you find particularly useful? | Participants group work was particularly useful and challenging too, because professionals in the field of language education exchanged ideas, their own practice examples and experience and closely worked on designing implementation plans for the publications they were ‘in charge of’. |
| How will you use what you learnt/ developed in the event in your professional context? | As an editor for language textbooks I am very much interested in promoting inclusive, plurilingual and intercultural pedagogic approaches. The ECML products gave me a lot of material to work with in my future editorial work. |
| How will you further contribute to the project? | I plan to raise awareness for plurilingual and intercultural teaching and learning practice among all stakeholders involved. I will help my fellow colleagues reach the corresponding ECML products and get properly informed about ECML activities that they might find useful in their work. |

U organizaciji Evropskog centra za savremene jezike (eng. ECML) sa sjedištem u Gracu održana je radionica na temu *Medijacija ECML-ovih publikacija za plurilingvalno i interkulturno obrazovanje* u trajanju od 26-28. marta, 2014.godine. Trodnevna radionica je bila organizovana u vidu grupnog rada koji je slijedio nakon plenarnih diskusija za svaki od četiri projekta: 1) *Evropski portfolio za studente nastavnike jezika* (engl. EPOSTL), 2) *Većinski jezik učenja kao osnova za plurilingvalno obrazovanje* (engl. MARILLE), 3) *Programi mobilnosti za plurilingvalno i interkulturno obrazovanje* (engl. PluriMobil) I 4) *Integrисано учење садржаја I drugih jezika осим engleskog* (engl. CLIL – LOTE START).

Trideset pet učesnika iz dvadeset sedam zemalja članica ECML-a radilo je na implementacionim shemama gore navedenih publikacija I mogućnostima njihove diseminacije.

U uslovima povećane migracije u zemljama Evrope, inkluzivni, plurilingvalni i interkulturni pedagoški pristupi postaju integrativni dio kvalitetnog obrazovnog procesa, obrazovanja dostupnog svima i jednakog za sve. Jedan od ciljeva radionice bio je i iniciranje i podržavanje dijaloga između profesionalaca na polju obrazovanja u cilju prezentiranja autentičnih primjera iz prakse, razmjene iskustava I ideja vezanih za plurilingvalno I interkulturno obrazovanje.

Sva četiri projekta, odnosno publikacije koje ih prate odnose se na poboljšanje kvaliteta obrazovanja koje promoviše bolje poznavanje I razumijevanje drugih kultura, prihvatanje drugih kultura I poboljšanje komunikativnih kompetencija u drugim jezicima (PluriMobil I CLIL – LOTE START), bavljenjem potreba učenika koji uče na jeziku koji nije njihov maternji (MARILLE), obezbjeđivanje didaktičkog portfolija za nastavnike u cilju kreiranja potrebnog okvira za promišljanje tokom njihove obrazovne I radne prakse (EPOSTL).
