What did you find particularly useful?	Found particularly interesting the reflection on our role as teacher educators, how learning is taking place at this day and age, the emphasis on the quality of the teaching and learning in our schools, the need to have policy makers on board, the multiple roles we as educators have, the importance of nurturing teacher competences, challenges in teacher education, mediation descriptors in CEFR, plurilingual and intercultural education, research in language teacher education, the role of AI in language teaching and learning, the action oriented approach to teaching and learning, the role of learning environments, the role of teacher educators as agents of change, and the importance of reflection and self-evaluation.
