


#### **Role of the European Commission**



European Communiy 1987 – a building site with visions about a multilingual, mobile and well educated European youth


- Celebrating 30 years of the Treaty of Rome


Barcelona, March 2002: EU Heads of State and Government called for action "to improve the mastery of basic skills, in particular by teaching at least two foreign languages from a very early age"







#### Foreign Languages at School in Europe





#### **Proposal for a European benchmark for language competences**

By 2020, at least 50% of 15 year-olds should attain the level of independent user of a first foreign language (compared to the present 42 %).

*By 2020, at least 75% of pupils in lower secondary education should study at least two foreign languages (compared to the present 61 %)* 



# *Council conclusions on multilingualism and the development of language competences, May 2014*

At least 50% of 15 year-olds should attain the level of independent user of a first foreign language (compared to the present 42 %)

Mapping of national assessment methods according to CEFR for comparable results on EU level

Focus on teaching methodologies that produce better results in schools





#### TA Courses on Cultural Diversity & Newly Arrived Migrants

Course series of 3 short courses:

- Cultural Diversity in your Classroom
- Raising Awareness about the Situation of Newly Arrived Migrants
- Integrating Newly Arrived Migrant Students in Schools

Delivered in 2016 and 2017

Total enrolment of 6166 across courses and years

Average of 96% positive course reviews

Participants produced lesson plans and action plans to implement at classroom and school level

Focus of all courses was a mix of sharing relevant information (e.g. about the situation of newly arrived migrants) and how to practically address the topic in the classroom/school (e.g. through a lesson plan, reaching out to external organisations, etc.)

Ongoing course follow-up via alumni groups with a task to curate lesson plans, etc.


